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Health (Accelerating Consumer's Care by Expediting Self-Scheduling) ACCESS Act (S.1140)	Sen. Cassidy, Bill [R-LA], Sen. Padilla, Alex [D- CA]	This bill would adjust the Anti-Kickback Statute (AKS) to remove the regulatory ambiguity allowing digital health and appointment booking platforms to work together to better serve patients. Telehealth Response for E-prescribing Addiction Therapy Services Act (TREATS Act – H.R. 1627)	Rep. Norcross, Donald [D-NJ-1], Rep. Fitzpatrick, Brian K. [R-PA-1]	This bill would permanently waive the inperson requirement for the prescribing of controlled substances III-IV, specifically for substance use disorders and opioid use disorders. The PREVENT DIABETES Act (H.R.1523)	Rep. DeGette, Diana [D-CO-1], Rep. Bilirakis, Gus M. [R-FL-12]	This bill provides for the inclusion of virtual diabetes prevention program suppliers in the Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program Expanded Model. Peters, Scott H. [D- CA-50]	This bill would permanently extend certain in-home cardiopulmonary rehabilitation flexibilities. Permanent Telehealth from Home Act (H.R.1407)	Rep. Buchanan, Vern [R-FL-16], Rep. Miller, Max L. [R-OH-7], Rep. Thompson, Mike [D-CA-4]	This bill would permanently eliminate the originating site and geographic limitations for telehealth, which will help patients continue to be able to receive care through telehealth services regardless of the location of the provider or the patient. To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to expand eligible practitioners to furnish telehealth services (H.R. 1614)	Rep. Kelly, Mike [R-PA- 16], Rep. Thompson, Mike [D-CA-4]	This bill would permanently allow physician therapists, occupational therapists, speech language pathologists, and audiologists to provide telehealth services. Rural Telehealth and Education Enhancement Act of 2025 (H.R. 290)	Rep. Langworthy, Nicholas A. [R-NY-23], Rep. Pingree, Chellie [D-ME-1]	This bill reauthorizes the Distance Learning and Telemedicine Program through FY2030. This Department of Agriculture program provides grants to help rural communities gain the technology and training necessary to engage in telemedicine and distance learning.	Referred to the Subcommittee on Commodity Markets, Digital Assets, and Rural Development
